





The View From Here

The only thing good about February 2 is that one of our nephews celebrates his birthday that day. I gave up on the groundhog a long time ago. Inevitably two weeks after the little vermin predicts that spring is around the corner, we are hit with the worst snowstorm of the winter. Whether Phil sees his shadow or not (how can he not with all the TV cameras around?), spring will come. But winter is still here. As I write this, the snow and ice are only now beginning to melt, yet just outside my window, I can hear the songs of the birds that will soon be building their nest outside my office. Remnants of winter, signs of spring.

I thank God we live in a place where the changing seasons speak to me so powerfully. For Christians in this part of the world, the movement through Lent toward Easter is paralleled by the movement from the darkness and cold of winter to the light and warmth of Spring.

Lent is a season of preparation in which we are called to put off the ways of winter - cold, darkness, death - and put on the ways of Christ - warmth, light and new life. It is a season in which we are called to look inside our hearts, and have God do the same.

Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting. Psalm 139:23-24

That is our prayer during Lent. Lord, is there anything in me that would prevent me from experiencing the new life Easter can bring? What needs to die in me in order that Christ may live in me? What rocks do I have to remove, what soil must I till in order that the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ may grow in me? When we take the Lenten journey and do the Lenten work, we, too, can hear the voice of Spring in our lives.

See! The winter is past; the rains are over and gone. Flowers appear on the earth; the season of singing has come, the cooing of doves is heard in our land. Song of Solomon 2:11-12

<u>Ash Wednesday Worship – Feb. 14 at 7:00 pm</u>

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. The English word "Lent" comes from the Anglo–Saxon word *lencten*, which means "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of "Spring." Historically, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by converts and then became a time for penance by all Christians.

The use of ashes as a sign of mortality and repentance has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship, and the Imposition of Ashes can be a powerful nonverbal and experiential way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation. This practice is the historic focus of Ash Wednesday observance and gave the day its name.

Come and experience a time of intimate worship, prayer, and confession as we return to God. A service for all ages will be held on Wednesday, February 14th at 7:00 pm in the sanctuary.

I remember when I was growing my mom carried a lot of bags. She is a knitter, avid reader, and always prepared for every foreseeable contingency and so she would nearly always carry a large purse stuffed to the brim and one or two bags filled with yarn and knitting needles. I remember two bags in particular from my childhood. The first I remember because I had made it for her by embellishing a canvas bag using fabric markers to draw an elaborate treasure map complete with quicksand and other challenges. I remember because she loved me enough to carry it proudly even though I have no

skill in drawing. The second bag I remember because a Bible verse was printed across the front. She had received it from a women's retreat. Her bag daily reminded me "Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep" which is found in Romans 12:15. This verse reminds us of our call to be in community, to care about what is happening in the lives of people around us, and to let ourselves celebrate when appropriate and mourn when faced with loss.

Our calling as Christians is to care for those around us, serving as an overflow of our love for our Lord. Our daily lives are filled with opportunities to care. In this season, I pray God will give each of us the eyes to see the needs of others around us and compassion and wisdom to meet those needs. Some days we will not need to look very far, but every day we'll need to prepare our hearts by asking for the ability to truly see the people around us. Some days we'll meet the need by throwing a party and some days by quietly holding a hand. We will all experience pain in some form whether due to physical injury, illness, loss of a loved one, a mental health struggle, a divorce or other unexpected challenge. I hope we will all also have things to celebrate whether it is the joy of seeing sunshine interrupting the dark gray days of winter, the birth of a child, a wedding, a graduation, a new job, a little one riding a bike without training wheels for the first time or some other moment that makes us smile. As we journey together we will have so many opportunities to support one another and to grow in our faith by offering one another encouragement even if at times the most encouraging thing we can do is acknowledge the pain and weep together.

In addition to the informal support we regularly offer one another, Faith Church has a Congregational Care Team made up of church staff and incredible volunteers that exists to meet the needs of the congregation. Our Congregational Care Team serves by praying with and for you and those you love, mailing cards to folks recovering from illness or grieving losses, visiting with people in hospitals and nursing homes, delivering meals through Casserole Ministry, bringing home communion to our homebound members and more. It is our privilege to walk alongside you through your celebrations, challenges, and transitions. Our mission truly is to rejoice with those who rejoice and weep with those who weep. 
